1. Preamble

Annamacharya Institute of Technology and Sciences (Autonomous), Kadapa, relentlessly aims to achieve academic excellence by implementing new initiatives in teaching-learning and evaluation processes. Based on the directions of the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi and Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Anantapur (JNTUA) Anantapuramu, the institute is developed the curriculum for Master of Business Administration (MBA) Course to match the needs, expectations, and skill sets of students of the region, in the post-graduate programme offered from the academic year 2023-24.

1.1. APPLICATION AND COMMENCEMENT

- The regulations are quite comprehensive and include definitions of key terms, semester system, credit system, grading system and other relevant details.
- The regulations detailed herein shall apply to all the regular post-graduate programme offered by the Institute.
- The regulations shall be applicable and come into force to the student batches admitted from the academic year 2023-24
- The Institute may revise, amend or change the regulations, scheme of examinations and syllabi, from time to time, if found necessary and on approval by the Academic Council of the Institute, keeping the recommendations of the Board of Studies in view.
- Any or all such amendments shall be effective from such date and to such batches of students including those already under going the programme, as may be approved through Academic Council of the Institute.
- These regulations shall be called R23 Regulations.

1.2. PROGRAMMES OFFERED BY THE INSTITUTE

The following M.B.A programme is offered by the Institute from 2023-24.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- 2.1 Admission to the MBA programme shall be made subject to eligibility, qualification prescribed by APSICHE and the University from time to time.
- 2.2 Admission to the post graduate degree programme shall be made on the basis of either the merit rank or Percentile obtained by the qualified student in the relevant qualifying Examination/ the merit rank obtained by the qualified student in an entrance test conducted by Andhra Pradesh State Government (ICET) for MBA programme subject to reservations as laid down by the Govt. from time to time.
- 2.3 The medium of instructions for MBA Programme will be **ENGLISH** only.

3. MBA PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

- 3.1 The MBA Programme is in Semester pattern, with Four Semesters consisting of Two academic years, each academic year having Two Semesters (First/Odd and Second/Even Semesters). Each Semester shall be of 22 weeks duration (inclusive of Examinations), with a minimum of 90 instructional days per Semester

Second year-(IV semester)	18 credits of core courses, electives and Project.

- 3.2 The student shall not take more than four academic years to fulfill all the academic requirements for the award of MBA degree from the date of commencement of first year first semester, failing which the student shall for felt the seat in MBA programme.
- 3.3 UGC/AICTE specified definitions/descriptions are adopted appropriately for various terms and abbreviations used in these PG academic regulations, as listed below:

3.3.1 Semester scheme

Each Post graduate programme is of 2 academic years (4 semesters) with the academic year divided into two semesters of 15-18 weeks (90 instructional days) each, each semester having - ‘Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)’ and ‘Semester End Examination (SEE)’ and curriculum/course structure as suggested by AICTE are followed.

3.3.2 Credit courses

All subjects/ courses are to be registered by the student in a semester to earn credits which shall be assigned to each subject/ course in an L: T: P: C (lecture periods: tutorial periods: practical periods : credits) structure based on the following general pattern.

1 Hr. Lecture(L) per week	1credit
1 Hr. Tutorial(T) per week	1credit
1Hr. Practical(P) per week	0.5credit
2 Hours Practical(Lab)/week	1credit

Course like Human Values and Professional Ethics is mandatory course and will not carry any credits.

3.3.4 Massive Open Online Courses(MOOCs)

- 1) Institution intends to encourage the students to done MOOCs during second year (III semester).
- 2) The MOOC(s) shall be offered for the existing course titles (professional core or professional electives).
- 3) The department shall give a list of standard MOOCs providers among edx, Udacity, Coursera, NPTEL or any other standard providers, whose credentials are endorsed by the Concerned HOD.
- 4) A student shall choose an online course (relevant to his/her programme of study) from the given list of MOOCs providers, as endorsed by the teacher concerned, with the approval of the HOD.
- 5) The department shall appoint Coordinators / Mentors and allot the students to them who shall be responsible to guide students in selecting online courses and provide guidance for the registration, progress and completion of the same.

- 6) If MOOCs providers provide the result in percentage, in such case, the departments shall follow the grade table, while allotting letter grade for the MOOCs. If MOOCs provider declares result in grade, the institution shall consider the same.

- 7) In case of any deviation from the above, the committee appointed by the Principal shall take a decision for converting MOOC results into the relevant grade points.
- 8) In case a student fails to complete the MOOCs he/she shall re-register for the same with any of the providers from the list provided by the department. Still if a student fails to clear the course/s, the Institution shall evaluate for the said course/s for 100 marks as per the MOOCs syllabi during the final year.
- 9) In case any provider discontinues offering the course, Institution shall allow the student to opt for any other provider from the list provided by the department, for completion of the same course.

4. ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1 A student shall be eligible to appear for Semester End examinations if he/she acquires a minimum of 75% of attendance in aggregate of all the subjects (Including attendance in mandatory courses like Human Values & Professional Ethics) for that semester.
- 4.2 Condonation of shortage of attendance in aggregate upto 10% (65% and above and below 75%) in each semester may be granted by the College Academic Committee.
- 4.3 Shortage of Attendance below 65% in aggregate shall in NO case be condoned.
- 4.4 A student cannot avail the condonation for more than **TWO** times throughout his/her entire course of study.
- 4.5 A stipulated fee shall be payable towards condonation of shortage of attendance to the Institution.
- 4.6 Students whose shortage of attendance is not condoned in any semester are not eligible to take their end examination of that class and their registration shall stand cancelled.

4.7 A student will not be promoted to the next semester unless he/she satisfies the attendance requirements of the present semester. They may seek readmission for that semester when offered next.

4.8 A student fulfilling the attendance requirement in the present semester shall not be eligible for readmission into the same class.

5. EVALUATION-DISTRIBUTION AND WEIGHTAGE OF MARKS

The performance of a student in every subject/course (including practicals) will be evaluated for 100marks each, with 40 marks allotted for CIE (Continuous Internal Evaluation) and 60 marks for SEE (Semester End-Examination).

5.1 Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

5.1.1 Two Internal Examinations shall be held during the semester for 40 marks. First internal examination shall be conducted on half of the syllabus and second internal examination shall be conducted on remaining half of the syllabus.

In each internal exam, a student shall answer three questions of five in 2 hours. All the Questions shall be of equal weightage of 10 marks. Marks obtained for 30 will be converted to 40 by multiplying with 4/3.

5.1.2 Final Internal marks for a total of 40 marks shall be arrived at by considering the marks secured by the student in both the internal examinations with 80% weightage to the better internal exam and 20% to the other.

5.1.3 If the student is absent for the internal examination, no re-exam shall be conducted and internal marks for that examination shall be considered as zero.

5.1.4 CIE for the practical courses:

- For practical subjects there shall be a continuous evaluation during the semester for 40 sessional marks. Day-to-day work in the laboratory shall be evaluated for 30 marks by the concerned laboratory teacher based on the regularity/record/viva.
- One Internal examination at the end of the semester will be conducted by the concerned laboratory teacher for 10Marks.
- Internal marks will be arrived by summing up the marks through Day-to-day work and through internal Examination.
- The end examination shall be conducted by the concerned laboratory teacher and senior expert in the same subject of the department.

5.2 Semester End-Examination (SEE)

5.2.1 Semester End examination of theory subjects shall have the following pattern:

- i. Five questions shall be set from each of the five units with either/or type for 10 Marks each
- ii. 6th question shall be the case study for 10 marks.
- iii. All the questions have to be answered compulsorily.
- iv. Each question may consist of one, two or more bits.

5.2.2 The end semester examination for laboratory Courses shall be conducted for 60 marks by the laboratory teacher concerned and one senior teacher of the same department nominated by the Principal.

5.3 Requirement for clearing any course

- i. The students have to obtain a minimum of 50 % marks in the CIE and end examination taken together; otherwise they will be awarded grade-F in that course. F is considered as a fail grade indicating that the student has to reappear for the end examination in that course and obtain a non fail-grade for clearing that course.
- ii. In other words to pass in a course, a student shall score 24 marks (40% in SEE or more) out of 60 marks in the end examination and also shall score 50 marks or more out of 100 in the end examination and the continuous internal assessment put together.
- iii. A part from the regular end examinations, the college may also schedule and conduct supplementary examinations for all courses for the benefit of students with backlogs. Such of the students writing supplementary examinations as supplementary candidates, may have to write more than one examination per day.
- iv. There is no provision for improvement of grade in any course of any semester. A student who has already appeared for a course in a semester and passed the examination is not entitled to reappear in the same course for improvement of letter grades.

6. INTERNSHIP

- Student is allowed to take up internship during summer after II sem. Internship Report has to be submitted in III semester to the department after approval by the concerned supervisor/mentor and the Head of the department. Internship Report is evaluated for 50 marks.

- The report has to be evaluated by the Head, Supervisor/ mentor and a senior faculty of the department. A candidate has to secure a minimum of 50% of marks to be declared successful.
- If he fails to obtain the minimum marks, he has to reappear for the same during the supplementary examinations as and when conducted.

7. CASE STUDY

Case study shall contain the identification of the real life problem, variables influencing the problem, qualitative/quantitative technique application and conclusion of the results. Every teacher handling theory course shall give certain number say 5-6 case problems and guide the students to solve the cases during the instruction itself.

8. SEMINAR PRESENTATION

There shall be a seminar on emerging topics in II semester. For the seminar, the student shall collect the information on a specialized topic, prepare a technical report, and submit it to the department. It shall be evaluated by the departmental committee consisting of Head of the Department, seminar supervisor and a senior faculty member. The seminar report shall be evaluated for 50 internal marks. There shall be no semester end examination for the seminar.

9. PROJECT WORK

- 9.1** A Project Review Committee (PRC) shall be constituted with the Head of the Department as Chairperson, Project Supervisor and one senior faculty member of the Department offering the MBA programme.
- 9.2** A candidate is permitted to register for the project work after satisfying the attendance requirement in all the subjects, both theory and practicals in III Semester.
- 9.3** Every candidate shall be required to submit a thesis or dissertation on a topic approved by the Project Review Committee.
- 9.4** A candidate has to present proposal of project work in the beginning of IV semester. For submission of proposal of project work, a student, in consultation with his Project Supervisor, has to present the title, objective, and plan of action of his project work to the Project Work Review Committee (PRC) for approval within two weeks from the commencement of IV Semester. Only after obtaining the approval of the PRC, the student can initiate the Project work. One seminar in the middle of the semester on progress, and another two weeks before submission of final report are mandatory for internal assessment of 80 marks. Evaluation should be done by the PRC for 50 marks and the Supervisor will evaluate the work for the other 30 marks.

- 9.5** If a candidate wishes to change his/her topic of the project, he/she can do so with the approval of the PRC. However, the PRC shall examine whether or not the change of topic leads to a major change of his initial plans of project proposal. If yes, his/her date of registration for the project work starts from the date of change of topic.
- 9.6** After approval from the PRC, a soft copy of the thesis should be submitted for ANTI PLAGIARISM check and the plagiarism report should be included in the final thesis. The Thesis will be accepted for submission, if the similarity index is less than 30%. If the similarity index has more than the required percentage, the student is advised to modify accordingly and re-submit the soft copy of the thesis after one month (assessment and viva voce will be done during next supplementary exams schedule only). The maximum number of re-submissions of thesis after plagiarism check is limited to TWO.
- 9.7** Three copies of the Project Thesis, plagiarism report and at least one published research article certified by the supervisor and hod shall be submitted to the Academic Section, after submission of a research paper related to the project work in an approved journal with a better impact factor. A copy of the submitted research paper shall be attached to thesis.
- 9.8** The thesis shall be adjudicated by an external examiner selected by chairman of the Academic Council. For this, the Head of the Department shall submit a panel of three examiners from among the list of experts in the relevant specialization as submitted by the supervisor.
- 9.9** If the report of the external examiner is unsatisfactory, the candidate shall revise and resubmit the Thesis. If the report of the examiner is unsatisfactory again, the thesis shall be summarily rejected.
- 9.10** If the report of the examiner is satisfactory, the Head of the Department shall coordinate and make arrangements for the conduct of Project Viva- Voce examination. The Project Viva-Voce examination shall be conducted by a board consisting of the Supervisor, Head of the Department and the external examiner who adjudicated the Thesis. External viva-voce exam will be conducted for 120 marks. The candidate has to secure a minimum of 50% of marks in the combined internal and external examination.
- 9.11** If he fails to fulfill the requirements as specified in 9.10, he/she will reappear for the Viva-Voce examination only after three months. In the reappeared examination also, if he fails to fulfill the requirements, he/she will not be eligible for the award of the

degree, unless she/she is asked to revise and resubmit his project work by the board within a specified time period (within four years from the date of commencement of his/her first year first semester).

10. SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATIONS

At the end of each Semester there will be regular examinations of the current Semester. Those students who are unable to pass their courses in their previous attempt can appear for the examinations under supplementary category along with the regular students.

11. RE-REGISTRATION FOR IMPROVEMENT OF INTERNAL EVALUATION MARKS

Following are the conditions to avail the benefit of improvement of internal evaluation marks.

- 11.1** The candidate should have completed the course work and obtained examinations results for I, II, III and IV semesters.
- 11.2** He/she should have passed all the subjects for which the Internal Evaluation marks secured are more than 50%.
- 11.3** Out of the subjects the candidate has failed in the examination due to Internal Evaluation marks secured being less than 50%, the candidate shall be given one chance for each Theory subject and for a maximum of three Theory subjects for Improvement of Internal evaluation marks.
- 11.4** The candidate has to re-register for the chosen subjects and fulfill the academic requirements.
- 11.5** For each subject, the candidate has to pay a fee equivalent to one third of the semester tuition fee and the amount is to be remitted in the form of D.D.
- 11.6** In the event of availing the Improvement of Internal evaluation marks, the internal evaluation marks as well as the End Examinations marks secured in the previous attempt(s) for the reregistered subjects stand cancelled.

12. WITH-HOLDING OF RESULTS

If the candidate has any dues not paid to the institute or if any case of indiscipline or malpractice is pending against him/her, the result of such candidate shall be withheld and he/she will not be allowed /promoted into the next semester. The issue of awarding degree is liable to be with held in such cases.

13. GRADING PROCEDURE

13.1 Grades will be awarded to indicate the performance of students in each theory subject, laboratory/ practicals, seminar and project. Based on the percentage of marks obtained (Continuous Internal Evaluation plus Semester End Examination, both taken together), a corresponding letter grade shall be given.

13.2 10-point grading system with the following letter grades is followed:

Note: Whenever the performance of a student is cancelled in any course/courses due to Malpractice, he has to register for the End Examination in those course/courses consequently and has to fulfill all the norms required for award of Degree.

13.3 A student who has obtained an 'F' grade in any subject shall be deemed to have 'failed' and is required to reappear as a 'supplementary student' in the semester end examination, as and when offered. In such cases, internal marks in those subjects will remain the same as those obtained earlier.

13.4 To a student who has not appeared for an examination in any subject, 'AB' grade will be allocated in that subject, and he/she is deemed to have 'failed'. A student will be required to reappear as a 'supplementary student' in the semester end examination, as and when offered next. In this case also, the internal marks in those subjects will remain the same as those obtained earlier.

13.5 Computation of SGPA and CGPA

The UGC recommends the following procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

- The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e

$$SGPA(S_i) = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where C_i is the number of credits of the i^{th} course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i^{th} course.

- ii. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses under gone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum (C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where S_i is the SGPA of the i^{th} semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

- iii. The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the Memorandum of Marks /transcripts.

Thus, CGPA=(27x7.44)+(27x6.9)+(30x7.3)+(18x6.8)/102=7.14

15. PASSING STANDARDS

A student shall be declared 'successful' or 'passed' in a semester, if he/she secures a GP ≥ 6 ('B' grade or above) in every subject/course in that semester (i.e. when the student gets an SGPA ≥ 6.00 at the end of that particular semester); and he/she shall be declared successful or 'passed' in the entire PG graduate programme, only when gets a CGPA ≥ 6.00 for the award of the degree as required.

After the completion of each semester, a grade card or grade sheet shall be issued to all the registered students of that semester, indicating the letter grades and credits earned. It will show the details of the courses registered (course code, title, no. of credits, grade earned, etc.), credits earned.

16. AWARD OF DEGREE

A student who registers for all the specified subjects/ courses as listed in the course structure and secures the required number of 102 credits (with CGPA ≥ 5.0), within 4 academic years from the date of commencement of the first academic year, shall be declared to have 'qualified' for the award of MBA degree in the chosen
